E-procurement Strategy Workshop

A workshop was held on 27th May, 2014 to consider the draft e-procurement strategy developed by M/s International Governance Solution (IGS). It was chaired by Managing Director, PPRA. The World Bank consultants Dr. Paul Schapper and Mr. Rajesh Shakya, during their presentation, introduced the concept of e-procurement, its essential components and highlighted its significance. Moreover, they also discussed the legislation, infrastructure, security, preferred design, costs and implementation of e-procurement in the Pakistan perspective. Representatives of various organizations participated in the workshop with their valuable comments and questions on the draft e-procurement strategy. They include World Bank, Federal PPRA, Punjab PPRA, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa PPRA, Sindh PPRA, Balochistan PPRA, State Bank of Pakistan, Finance Department of Gilgit Baltistan, Finance Department of AJK, Punjab Information Technology Board, Ministry of Information Technology and Telecom, Islamabad and Pakistan Computer Bureau, Islamabad.

Global Distance Learning Network (GDLN) Video Conference held on 20th May, 2014

A GDLN video conference was held on 20th May, 2014 chaired by Ms. Nazrat Bashir, Managing Director, PPRA. The video conference was a follow up on Second South Asia Regional Public Procurement Forum held from 25th – 27th March, 2014 (Islamabad Conference Action Plan 2014). The heads of the public procurement institutions of Afghanistan, Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Pakistan, Bhutan, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Maldives and GDLN HQ (Washington) discussed the proposed follow-up arrangements on the action plan.

Technical Secretariat of South Asian Public Procurement Network (SAPPN) established at PPRA

The Technical Secretariat of South Asian Public Procurement Network (SAPPN) has been established at Public Procurement Regulatory Authority (PPRA) Islamabad till it is relocated to the SAARC Secretariat in Kathmandu Nepal. SAPPN is an initiative of the countries in the region as a regional technical mechanism and it comprises government institutions in the South Asian countries, which are responsible for public procurement regulation, management and modernization. Pakistan has developed a Project Proposal for making the SAPPN fully functional through possible funding from donors.

Establishment of the SAPPN Network was agreed to during the 2nd South Asian Region Public Procurement Conference held in Islamabad in March 2014. The objectives of the Network are to create and make available a concrete space for reflection, discussion, mutual knowledge, supportive technical cooperation, training and exchange of experiences, lessons and good practices among its constituents aimed at enhancement of the public procurement practices in the region, as well as to foster regional cooperation.

The SAPPN would build upon the network already developed for regional cooperation among the public procurement institutions and staff of the South Asian countries through bilateral and regional interactions and regional conferences on the subject sponsored by the development partners, such as the World Bank and Asian Development Bank. The SAPPN agenda would include initiatives for regional cooperation on effective public procurement organization, human resource development, and promotion of new public procurement tools, such as electronic government procurement.

Training Need Assessment and Training Strategy Workshop

1477 Letters Indicating Violations Issued to Procuring Agencies

During the period from April through June, 2014 the Procuring Agencies uploaded 7626 tender notices on the PPRA website. On scrutiny of the tender notices, it was found that 1477 tender notices were in violations of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004. As a standard procedure, all the procuring agencies were informed about the violations and hence advised to remove the violations to make the tender notices in accordance with the provisions of the Rules. Month-wise breakup of the uploaded tender notices and the violations are given in the following table:-

The violations committed by the procuring agencies mostly related to Rule 13 (Response Time), Rule-28 (Opening of Bids) and Rule-33 (Rejection of Bids). The percentage of compliance of Public Procurement Rules, 2004, on indicated violations by PPRA, was 8.0 % during the quarter.
