Background:

It has come to our attention that M/S N Hussain Engineering & EMP Co Pvt Ltd has submitted a bid to participate in a recent tendering process initiated by KPT. This Company was previously blacklisted on the Public Procurement Regulatory Authority (PPRA) due to the submission of forged documents. While the company now operates under a different name, all other identifying information remains the same (i.e., address, license number, and relevant certifications). The company has provided an undertaking asserting that it is not blacklisted.

Legal Issues for Consideration:

The legal issues under consideration are:

1. Whether the change of the company's name removes the effects of its previous blacklisting.
2. Whether the company's bid can be considered valid under PPRA Rules despite the prior blacklisting.

Relevant Provisions of Law:

1. Public Procurement Rules, 2004 (PPRA Rules):

o Rule 18.

The procuring agency shall disqualify a supplier or contractor if it finds, at any time, that the information submitted by him concerning his qualification as supplier or contractor was false and materially inaccurate or incomplete.

o Rule 19(1) and (4)

Provides that procuring agencies may disqualify or exclude any company or individual from participation if they are involved in fraudulent, corrupt, or collusive practices, or any other activity that could undermine fair competition.

A bidder who has been declared blacklisted or debarred by a foreign country, international organization or other foreign institutions shall be treated as blacklisted and debarred from participating in any public procurement proceedings or entering into any public contract for such period as declared by that foreign country, international organizations or other foreign institutions.

2. Companies Act, 2017:

Section 13(3)

- o (3) The change of name shall not affect any rights or obligations of the company, or render defective any legal proceedings by or against the company and any legal proceedings that might have been continued or commenced against the company by its former name may be continued by or commenced against the company by its new name.

1. **Validity of the Undertaking:** The Company's undertaking stating that it is "not blacklisted" appears to be misleading and potentially fraudulent, as PPRA's blacklisting remains in effect against the entity, notwithstanding the name change. Under PPRA Rules, providing misleading information is a serious offense that could further disqualify a company from participation.

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2. **Implications of Blacklisting under a Different Name:** The blacklisting by PPRA is imposed on the legal entity, not merely the name it operates under. Changing the company name does not negate the blacklisting; rather, it continues to apply to the legal entity as a whole. The PPRA Rules and legal precedents establish that disqualified entities cannot bypass sanctions through rebranding.
3. **Liabilities and Legal Continuity:** Under the Companies Act, 2017, and legal principles in Pakistani law, a name change does not create a new entity. Thus, the company's prior liabilities and restrictions remain applicable. Considering this, M/S N Hussain Engineering & EMP Co Pvt Ltd remains subject to its blacklisting status until the PPRA or an appropriate authority formally lifts this restriction.

In light of the above analysis, it is our opinion that KPT should not accept M/S N Hussain Engineering & EMP Co Pvt Ltd's bid on the following grounds:

1. **Continued Applicability of Blacklisting:** The blacklisting imposed by PPRA remains in effect regardless of the change in the company's name. By participating in this bidding process, the company has attempted to circumvent the PPRA sanctions, which is legally impermissible.
2. **Misrepresentation in the Undertaking:** The undertaking by M/S N Hussain Engineering & EMP Co Pvt Ltd declaring itself as not blacklisted is misleading and raises serious concerns regarding compliance with PPRA Rules.
3. **Risk of Legal Liability:** Accepting this company's bid may expose KPT to legal challenges from other bidders and regulatory scrutiny, given the PPRA restrictions.

We recommend that KPT in case where the firm has furnished an undertaking contrary to the fact that the said firm is blacklisted on website of PPRA, the procuring agency may issue show cause notice to the firm giving out evidence of its being blacklisted. The show cause notice must indicate that in case the undertaking given is found to be false, the firm will be blacklisted by KPT and security & performance deposit will be forfeited.

Based on the application of Pakistani law, M/S N Hussain Engineering & EMP Co Pvt Ltd's change of name does not invalidate the blacklisting imposed by PPRA. As such, its bid should be rejected on grounds of misrepresentation and ongoing disqualification under the PPRA Rules. Should the entity seek future eligibility, it must obtain formal relief from the PPRA, explicitly lifting the blacklisting status.

Blacklisted/Debarred Firms-Pakistan

Rule 19 of the Public Procurement Rules, 2004 (amended vide S.R.O. No. 834(I)/2021 dated 28th June, 2021)

requires that

The procuring agency shall devise a comprehensive mechanism for blacklisting and debarment of bidders for a specified time in accordance with regulations made by the Authority, and the bidder or the bidders shall be declared as-

(a) blacklisted and henceforth cross debarred for participation in any public procurement or disposal proceedings for the period of not more than ten years, if corrupt and fraudulent practice as defined in these rules is established against the bidder or the bidders in pursuance of blacklisting proceedings;

(b) blacklisted and henceforth cross debarred for participation in respective category of public procurement or disposal proceedings for a period of not more than three years, if the bidder fails to perform his contractual obligations during the execution of contract or breaches the contract due to his capacity and capability to perform or otherwise. However, procuring agency shall initiate such blacklisting or debarment proceedings after exhausting the forum of arbitration, provided that such provision exists in the conditions of contract, and if such failure or breach is covered in the respective dispute settlement clauses of the contract, and

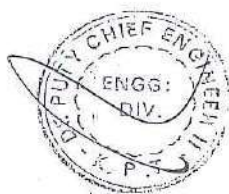
(c) blacklisted and henceforth cross debarred for participation in respective category of public procurement or disposal proceedings for a period of not more than six months, if the bidder fails to abide with a bid securing declaration, however without being indulged in any corrupt and fraudulent practice.

(3) The bidder may file the review petition before the Authority within thirty days of communication of such blacklisting or barring action after depositing the prescribed fee and in accordance with procedure issued by the Authority, and the Authority shall evaluate the case and decide within ninety days of filing of review petition. The decision of the Authority shall be considered as final

In observance of the above said Rule, various procuring agencies reported the firms which they have blacklisted/debarred permanently or temporarily to PPRA, as per details given below.

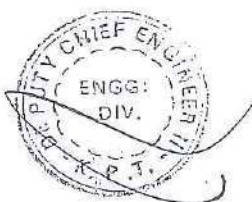

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE DEPARTMENTAL TENDER COMMITTEE HELD ON
09-10-2024 IN THE COMMITTEE ROOM OF THE ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT, KPT.**

**NAME OF WORK:- REPAIR / RENOVATION OF VARIOUS SHEDS AT M.I YARD
WEST WHARF.**

1. West Wharf plays a critical role for global trade and commerce of our country serving as hubs for the exchange of goods and commodities. In the circumstances it requires to update the port infrastructure Within Port limits, in which the storage Sheds are one of the essential component for storage, protection of goods and logistics operations in safe and sound manner to avoid untoward incidences from extreme weather conditions too.
2. Dy. Traffic Manager (W) vide letter placed at S.No.01 had requested for repair of Sheds at West Wharf, to attend said works, the concerned AXEN (MIY) visited each and every shed to ascertain the required works. During the visit the identification of structural deficiency, leaks, repair of gates, platform, drainage etc has been observed, which are required to be attended necessary to avoid any unforeseen incidence and to improve structural integrity and functionality of sheds. Most of the gates are eroded, steel plates are broken some of shed gates were malfunctioning as reported by concerned DTM staff. (Photographs attached at S.No. 02) for kind reference.
3. It is pertinent to mention here that there exists Total 09 Nos. of Sheds at West Wharf, which are being used for different purposes for storage of valuable cargo. The overall area of these sheds are 40,000 Sqr.Mtr (Approx).
4. Keeping in view of the present situation of handing over the East wharf to AD Ports, it become essential to rehabilitate / renovate these sheds to overcome the rush of cargo planned to moved to West Wharf.
5. Keeping in view the above scenario, the repairing of sheds at West Wharf is crucial for maintain the efficiency and safety of Port Operations, Civil Works Division aims to address the existing repair and maintain challenges to enhance the operational resilience and to ensure the continue success of Port facilities in nurturing global trade.
6. Accordingly, the tenders were invited through Press on 21-07-2024 and KPT / PPRA & MoMA Websites on 25-07-2024 and received on 13-08-2024 in accordance under Rule 36 (b) of PPRA.
7. In response, the following (04) Four Firms have submitted their sealed Technical / Financial Proposals.
